

### OUR STORY

I love jewellery. I hoarded expensive metals and precious stones for two decades only to realise I suffer from Nickel allergy. My skin would turn red and itchy in 30 minutes after wearing the jewellery. All the precious stones and diamonds from my ancestors suddenly felt voiceless.


That is when I discovered Polymer Clay: An alternate versatile medium to make eclectic jewellery! What started out of curiosity to fill my own void turned into a hobby and thereafter into a small business.

Today, I can tell you that I don't make jewellery. I make wearables for you to express yourself and leave a legacy of story-telling collectibles behind.



### NICKEL ALLERGY CONTACT DERMATITIS

Nickel allergy is the most frequent cause of contact allergy worldwide. Extensive research shows that average of 20% of adults and 10% of children are sensitive to nickel. And it is present in most metals. Hence, the brand uses 304L medical surgical stainless steel grade. This still has very tiny amounts of nickel. To further reduce this percentage, we aim upgrade this year to 316L that has even lesser traces of it. We also offer titanium upon request that sees no traces of nickel and is the most safest but an expensive option.



### **POLYMER CLAY**

### WHAT?

- Polymer clay is a hardenable modelling clay that is made from the polymer polyvinyl chloride (PVC)
- It contains ingredients for malleability, softness, colour, and texture, such as plasticisers that are flexible, fillers that enhance texture, and colouring substances among others
- Non-toxic plasticisers are used and the clay is free from harmful chemicals



- Alternate medium to metals
- Highly versatile
- While the PVC used in clay is not entirely sustainable, crafting practices are made eco-friendly through reduced carbon footprint compared to metals and left over clay is reused to minimise wastage
- Luxury in terms of its durability, slow- production, and handmade nature

Colours are more than visual elements – they convey information, evoke emotions, and influence decisions. Drawing from the psychology of colour, each creation at Coloured Ears begins as an intuitive journey, using colour as a personal tool to translate the familiar and unfamiliar from the subconscious into open–ended, wearable art. This process invites vulnerability and uncertainty, offering space to unlearn perfection and embrace imperfection, celebrating unconditioned forms of beauty.

The creation process is a harmonious blend of spontaneity and craftsmanship. Through colour alchemy, hues and textures are layered and explored to craft original, statement–making designs. Each piece is hand–sculpted with care, shaped by an intimate and meditative process that ensures no two creations are ever alike. The pieces are then fired with care, a step that preserves their durability while maintaining their delicate artistry. Following this, every creation is fine–tuned through sanding and polishing to achieve a refined, flawless finish. Finally, the components are thoughtfully assembled, transforming individual elements into cohesive, wearable stories.

More than just jewellery, each Coloured Ears creation becomes an unrepeatable moment in time – an embodiment of individuality, experimentation, and the infinite possibilities of design.

Pronounced as "Kaan-su".


KHONSU is an Egyptian god of moon. As the name means a 'traveller' and the design depicts flow and movement through its intricate work.












### KAO


















# NARA


















### ANDROMEDA



The Andromeda series explores the various strokes of a painter that looks like the eye of a galaxy. The Andromeda metaphor is used here to depict the importance of a stroke for the safekeeping of the psyche–soul. For the painter, a stroke is a rescue of essential inner qualities in the face of outward pressure and hostility.





#### KINTSUGI



Kintsugi is the Japanese art of repairing broken objects using a binding glue/powder. Here, this form is intentionally broken and given a repaired look and fixed with liquid clay to signify beauty in distress. In reality, that is what all our lives are made of!





### MOON



















## TERRAZZO STONES




Terrazzo stones is a personal childhood memory sealed in the hearts of almost every Indian homes built before 90's.






## **ABSTRACT STUDS**





























## QUADS




























































#### **GEOMET**



Geomet is a series of abstract geometry where multiple shapes are sketched and organically cut to form a single piece. They are large statements either in single or multiple colours for various representations of space.











#### CAIRNS



Cairns is a representation of balance, restoration, and dependability. The name comes from Scottish Gaelic. Pronounced as "kern-s" is a man-made stack of stones piled on/against one another. Cairns are designed to be playful, earthy, and traditional to exude different moods.



















### SUKOHŌ



Pronounced as "skoh-ho".

SUKOHŌ in Japanese means 'to break'. This series experiments with mismatched pairs in colours, shapes, and even size to reimagine play in wearable art. It also includes styles that project 'broken and torn' to convey intentional acceptance through art.

Sivaraman is a multi-faceted self-taught intuitive artist, sculptor, jewellery designer, and creative coach, whose diverse talents converge in healing, fine arts, and wearable art.

In fine arts, her rare ability to draw blindfolded, ambidextrously, and in continuous one-line simultaneously is a testament to her deep connection with intuition and the subconscious mind. Known for these unique, immersive techniques, she creates abstract expressionist works that evoke profound emotions and movements. Her venture into whimsical surrealism playfully reinterpreting Indian culture and mythology with exaggerated forms and googly eyes - has captured widespread attention. Using a range of mediums, from ink and acrylic to lamp smoke and clay, she applies her artistry to paper, canvas, and even walls, practicing 'Surrealist Automatism Art' to explore thoughtlessness, embrace anxiety, and connect with deeper layers of consciousness.



Her jewellery brand, Coloured Ears, celebrates unapologetic self–expression with gender–fluid, hypoallergenic, handmade pieces. Showcased at Lakme Fashion Week, New York Pride, and a contemporary art gallery in West London, United Kingdom, it cements her influence in both art and fashion.

With a profound background in evidencebased social work and research. Sivaraman holds double master's degrees from Oxford University, UK, and Tata Institute of Social Sciences, India, For over a decade, she has championed labour rights, addressed issues like violence against women, sexual violence, and trafficking in India's textile industries, and authored manuals for non-profits and Corporate Social Responsibility initiatives. Now a full-time creative coach, she focuses on online coaching for all genders, with plans for in-person workshops, retreats, and coaching. Her mission is to foster healing and personal growth globally through creative coaching that blends introspection with healing.
